PLATEAU FENCE LIZARD *Sceloporus tristichus* DESCRIPTION: A small (up to 80 mm or 3.1" from snout to vent), gray-brown to golden-brown lizard with pointed, keeled, overlapping scales. Most specimens have two light stripes on the back and a broad, muted, gray mid-dorsal stripe. There are often small, dark blotches between the stripes.

Description. The Plateau Lizard (*Sceloporus tristichus*) is a moderate-sized (< 90 mm SVL) spiny lizard with a brown or gray dorsal background color overlain with stripes, chevrons, or crossbars. Striped morphs typically have a light dorsolateral stripe on each side, and between the two stripes are a gray mid-dorsal stripe and a row of small dark blotches or spots on either side of that mid-dorsal stripe.

NMHS - *Sceloporus tristichus*

General Description: Plateau Fence Lizard (*Sceloporus tristichus*) are small lizards (total length to about 6 inches) with fairly coarse scales. The dorsal pattern ranges from longitudinal stripes to broken crossbars, but the dorsal pattern usually is a gray-brown background with broken brown crossbars. The blue throat patch usually is divided into two small spots, one on each side of the throat (in the similar Western Fence Lizards, the patch usually is single).
