Quick facts. Tomatoes, peppers, beans and peas are good choices for seed saving. They have flowers that are self-pollinating and seeds that require little or no special treatment before storage. Seeds from biennial crops such as carrots or beets are harder to save since the plants need two growing seasons to set seed.

Larger populations will increase the chance that a variety will maintain a higher level of genetic diversity, which is more important for long term seed saving and/or when growers regenerate their seeds often (say every 1-3 years).

Seed Saving Chart

Wait five days for all the good seeds to drop, then rinse away the gunk at the top. Wash the seeds in several changes of water, and lay them out in a single layer on a glass or plastic plate or screen. Put the plate in a warm place until the seeds are fully dry, which can take several weeks.

Seeds from many plants can be saved simply by collecting them as they dry. Tomatoes take a bit more work. Tomato seeds are enclosed in a gel-like sack that contains growth inhibitors, which prevent the seeds from sprouting inside the tomato. The best way to remove this gel covering is to allow the fruits to rot and ferment.

How to Save Tomato Seeds to Grow Next Year

To save seed is to participate in the process of natural selection. If you save seed only from the biggest tomato of the bunch and replant them year after year, you'll eventually end up with seeds that produce plants on which all the tomatoes are bigger. The same holds true for almost any other trait.

Open Pollinated or heirloom, self-pollinated plants are the only varieties that will grow true from seed, meaning the seedlings will be exactly like the parents. These are the seeds worth saving.
